SIT, WALK, STAND



RAIL FAN - MODEL Railroader by Rev. Stephen R. Seidler

"OLD RAILROADERS NEVER DIE. THEY..."

In reflecting on Gen. Douglas MacArthur's famous statement about soldiers, I am drawn to concentrate on railroaders of all stripes; be they rail fans," hoggers," or model railroaders. Former railroaders never die, they just lay track in a new and exciting direction. One former railroader who is on-track to new destinations is **REA** member Robert Leidigh (**NYCRR**.) For Bob, there is no RIP track (RR slang for Repair In Place), or holding yard, or side track, or back shop. He left railroading and trucking to take up a better ministry passing out Gospel tracts and playing his violin for God's glory. This article was gleaned from materials supplied by Bob himself, and an article compiled by fellow **REA** member Jay Glenewinkel. Supplemental information was located on the internet, along with that supplied by the New York Central System Historical Society. We thank them all for their gracious assistance.

Our soldier/railroader is **REA** member Robert Leidigh of Bryan, Ohio. In the 1920s, before the Great Depression, Bob's grandparents and his father lived on a farm in Wabasha, near Red Wing and Winona, Minnesota. They moved to Ohio and Bob was born in the late 1930s. Growing up in Bryan, Bob's story is one of perseverance, dedication and faith. At the age of fifteen, he took an interest in music and started to learn how to play the fiddle (violin). It did not take him very long to perfect his craft. Bob said, "The LORD affected my very young manhood, but I wanted to play with Country & Western groups in bars and dance halls. This is a 'no-no' if you are to be separated, holy or for the LORD. It is a bad example." He did perform with a variety of different C&W bands on the radio. As Bob grew older, he discovered a bigger and better way to utilize the musical talent God had provided for him. He then changed his tune and began playing with various Gospel music groups.


Shortly after Bob finished high school in the early 1950s, he enlisted in the United States Army. For the next few years he would serve his country stationed at Fort Hood, Texas, 80 miles northwest of Austin. After completion of his service in the military, Bob returned home to Ohio. He landed a job with the **New York Central Railroad**.

Bob's career as a NYC railroader was just beginning in the 1950s as the end of an era was fast approaching for the railroad. His job assignments varied from working at the Toledo (Ohio) Yard Tower to serving as bridge operator over the Maumee River. He saw his fill of boats loaded with grain and iron ore. He moved up in rank, and up in location to southern Michigan. Bob was primarily assigned as the WB Tower operator in Adrian, MI. WB was one of three towers in Adrian. It was here that he was in charge of the interlocking levers to align the switches, signals, phones, and train movement where the NYC crossed the Wabash RR. The mainline of the Toledo/Lake Division was jointly operated with the Wabash, and at one time intersected with the Cincinnati Northern over which coal was moved north to the Jackson Yards. The mainline of the NYC (former Lake Shore & Michigan Southern) from Toledo, OH to Elkhart, IN intersected at Adrian with the Wabash and DT&I (former Detroit, Lima & Northern) railroads. When not pulling interlocking levers in the Adrian Tower, Bob often practiced on his violin. He remembers

the massive **NYC** locomotives thundering past on the diamonds, as their *chug-a-chug-a-chug* gracefully faded into history. The whine and hum of the sleek diesels resplendent in their Gray/Black/White livery was not as impressive as steam. However, they were taking center stage - beginning to dominate on the iron road. It was clear that change was in the air and that everyone and everything would be impacted.



Bob worked on the NYCRR extra board on call. He was a tower operator in the late 1950s. As the 1960s rolled around, the NYC began to install CTC (Centralized Traffic Control.) The mainline was then operated from a Dispatcher Panel in Toledo, thus eliminating the need for an interlocking tower. The Adrian Tower, WB, was taken out of service and eventually torn down. The stone foundation of the tower is still visible in the southwestern corner of the diamonds. As a result of CTC. Bob was laid off from the railroad. A short time later he found employment with a trucking company. Between the railroad and driving trucks, Bob was actively involved in the transportation industry for a number of years.

Beyond his varied and interesting work history, Bob has endured his share of heart-

aches, including the passing of his first wife in 1988. His faith in the LORD kept him strong, and through his love and devotion for Christ, God guided Bob through the grieving process. Bob's prayers would be answered when he met a beautiful lady by the name of Carolyn. She, too, had lost a spouse. Robert and Carolyn shared this painful experience together with God's help. A little over a year later, in 1991, they joined hands in Holy Matrimony before God, their families, and friends at Eastland Baptist Church in Bryan Ohio, where twenty years later they still serve together.


Today, after 60 years, Robert Leidigh is still playing his fiddle. Bob struggled with the LORD over playing in night clubs among alcohol and women, but he wanted to play in band on stage. The LORD convicted him and found him personally wanting. Bob went to an altar call and repented of his sins. He was wonderfully saved (born again). Bob says, "Now our band has a rule, NO ALCOHOL - praise God!" At 79 years young you will find Bob playing with three gospel groups. They play in rest homes, senior centers and churches around Bob's hometown. Preacher Wally James Cosgren often comes over from Omaha, Nebraska. He, James Avery, and Bob get together to play and record their music. Several years ago they made a CD with the "Country Pals". Bob and Wally recorded a cassette tape, "Praise Strings". It is personally delightful to sit back and listen to the beautiful arrangements they did on wellknown hymns. Another cassette, equally rewarding, was recorded with Margaret Shadel on piano, Wally on guitar and Bob on violin. Whenever and wherever they can sing and play, their goal is to celebrate and glorify God.

Robert Leidigh is more than a believer in Christ, he is a doer. He doesn't just pray for rain. When he is in need, he says his prayers and prepares his fields for the rain that he knows the good LORD will provide. "Preparing his field for rain" is a quote used in the book and motion picture "Facing the Giants" created by Sherwood Pictures. Bob is privileged to have the LORD as his Savior and Guide in this troubled world in which we live. Bob says, "Trust and obey, for there is no other way!" When Bob is not playing music you will find him

and Carolyn down at the Bryan Amtrak Depot, at a shopping mall, a county fair or some other festival. While Carolyn reads, Bob enjoys watching trains, then greeting people and proclaiming the Word of God to them. They try to pass out tracts about once a week. Bob uses tracts from World Missionary Press Inc., P O Box 120, New Paris, IN 46553.

Note: The **New York Central Railroad** became a part of the **Consolidated Rail Corporation** (**Conrail**) in 1970. In 1999 **Conrail's** assets were divided between **CSX** and **Norfolk Southern**. **CSX** currently operates the line through Adrian, MI. The **Norfolk Southern** currently operates the mainline that runs through Bryan, OH.

NYC'S M-497

Bob and Carolyn Leidigh reside in Bryan, Ohio, which is also home to the Ohio Art Co. – better known as the makers of the "Etch-A-Sketch." Bryan was the scene of the U.S. Rail Speed Record for a passenger train set on July 23, 1966. This is recorded on a plaque at the Bryan AMTRAK depot. The **New York Central RR** already held the rail speed record, set on May 10, 1893, with their Engine #999. It is currently on display at the Museum of Science and Industry in Chicago, Illinois. The "EMPIRE STATE EXPRESS" reached a speed of 112.5 miles per hour. In 1966, **NYC**'s M-497 covered a 300 foot section of track (the length of a football field) in 1.112 seconds. The M-497 was a 13-year-old

RDC-3 Budd car with a fabricated shovel nose paint-It was ed blue. nicknamed "The Black Beetle." Mounted on the roof in a B36-H bomber engine pod were two J47-19 General Electric jet engines. The record-setting speed through Bryan was 183.85 miles per hour!

The patients: A fourteen-year-old girl and a seventeen-year-old boy. Twenty-nine pounds were found of the boy and little Beth was left to bleed to death with one leg amputated; yet she wouldn't die. Let's let Beth tell the story.

"I started on drugs when I was about ten and then I started listening to rock music. At first it was just soft rock, and then my life started revolving around it and it got harder and harder. Then I started listening to the words and doing what they told me and I started on drugs and smoking and living in immorality.

August 2nd was my birthday and I had just turned fourteen. On August 21 I ran away with a young man of seventeen. We were on drugs and living in sin. We had been gone for three days and had broken into a woman's house and stolen her car. I just remember that we were walking and the next thing I remember was waking up and seeing the lights of a train coming toward me and realizing that I had gotten hit by a train and that the second train was coming toward me. I rolled off the railroad track and lay there from 12:00 midnight until 4:00 in the morning. Some men heard my screams and they came and got me.

They rushed me to the hospital and I was there for three months. The boy had been killed instantly and one of my legs had been cut off by the train.

When I got my new leg and went home my life didn't change. My parents loved me and prayed for me, but it didn't matter. I didn't care about them and my heart was bitter against God and I hated God and I hated my family. My life at home was just a nightmare. I ran away again and was sleeping on the streets and any place I could find. I would sleep on the beach. I went to a half-way house and was there for two weeks. My parents came and got me and brought me to the Bethesda Home in Mississippi and I also rebelled there. I hated it there and I hated the girls when they prayed for me that the Lord would save me. But finally the Lord burdened my heart and He brought me to my knees and He saved my soul and since then my life has changed. He has given me a new desire and a new song in my mouth to sing praises unto Him. I just love the Lord so much and I want to serve Him all my life. The peace and joy I was searching for, I never found through drugs or through rock music; it was after I got saved that I found the real joy and the real peace and the real happiness I had been searching for all my life. I love the Lord with all my heart and I want to serve Him all my life. He IS the answer." "He that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out. " John 6:37


Railroad Romantic - Home with the Lord


And this wee little car that is built so compact,

Louis "Casey Jones" at the throttle of the legendary "City of New Orleans" that ran from Chicago to New Orleans.





PARENTS, WE MUST PRAY FOR OUR CHILDREN



let's be pleasant travelers, it's so short a ride.




