
A Breakthrough is coming!

II Kings chapter 3 tells the story of how Moab rebelled against the new king of Israel and refused to pay taxes. Mesha, King of Moab, assumed that Jehoram, king of Israel, was a weak leader and would not do anything about it. But, Jehoram convinced two other kings- Jehoshaphat, king of Judah and the king of Edom- and their armies, to join him against Moab. They journeyed through the wilderness of Edom for seven days and were without water. They almost gave up on living. Jehoshaphat realized, that in order for three armies to obtain water and survive in the wilderness (an impossible task), they needed to hear from God and asked the following question: "Is

there not here a prophet of the LORD, that we may enquire of the LORD by him?" One of the king of Israel's servants answered and said, "Here is Elisha, the son of Shaphat, which poured water on the hands of Elijah."



BlueBell Railroad Sussex, England





In the above two photos of this little steam engine, notice the coal bin on the rear, I took, (Joe Spooner) when I attended the International Railway Mission conference In Eastboarne, England in 2007. The Bluebell Railway is a heritage line running for nine miles along the border between East and West Sussex, England. It uses steam trains which operate between Sheffield Park and Kingscote, with an intermediate station at Horsted Keynes. After more than 50 years of separation, a resumed connection to the UK's rail network, to a UK terminus station north of Kingscote, in East Grinstead, is expected to open in March 2013.

The railway is managed and run largely by volunteers. The Bluebell also has a collection of almost 150 carriages and wagons, most of them pre-war, unrivalled in the south of England. The Bluebell Railway also preserved a number of steam locomotives even before the cessation of steam service on British mainline railways in 1968. 2007 marked the railway's 125th anniversary. 2009 marked the Bluebell Railway Preservation Society's 50th anniversary. 2010 marked the Bluebell's 50th anniversary of running services. To mark the event, the railway held a gala in August 2010 with all available home engines and two visitor engines. (information from Wikipedia)

"SCREAMING EAGLES" Photographer



One of our newest REA members is a "Screaming Eagles" photographer who has had a life-long passion for trains and railroading. Since his first days of railfanning on the Missouri Pacific in 1978, Jay Glenewinkel has photographed over 1000 roster shots of MP power, walked over 500 miles of MP track in all types of weather, collected over 100 slides, as well as obtaining over 50 timetables and rule books. "Screaming Eagles" was a nickname given to the Missouri Pacific RR due to a stylized eagle in rapid motion emblazoned on the side of their locomotives. The MoPac or MP and her sister railroad, the Chicago & Eastern Illinois, used an emblem called a "buzz saw" - appearing like the blade of a circular saw. However, they are consid-

ered "Fallen Flag" railroads. The C&EI was merged into the MP, which was merged into the Union Pacific RR in the 90s.

Jay is a Christian who places his faith in God, believing in Christ and the scriptures that he reads. He considers himself strongly spiritual, but not involved in any formal religious sanction. He knows Satan overwhelms him at

times to the point where he feels temporarily "lost," but knows Satan is clever at doing that. Jay's Christian life has been shaky – not that his faith itself has faltered – but his belief in religion is of guestion during these times. Jay knows God created the earth and that anywhere he goes upon its soils or waters he gets a greater appreciation for the work of God's handiwork. Religions are made by man, and look what man has given us. Through Jay's family, he has acquired a wealth of exposure to a myriad of different religions - none of which he claims for his own. He is non-denominational in Christianity, developing his spiritual nature by confirming his faith in Christ. Christ alone died for our sins, whereas NO religion can save or make a Christian. God, through the work of Jesus Christ, takes a person to heaven to be with Him eternally.

Railroading may be in Jay's blood for he grew up around the MoPac and Southern Pacific, with a sprinkle of the old "KATY" (MKT). He made numerous railfan journeys across the USA. Through a good friend who was a Mo-

Pac engineer, Jay operated his first real train, a MoPac SD40-2 #6044, at the age of 14 in 1984. He has since operated other locomotives. He went on to become a railroad employee as a crew van driver for the MP, then SP, then again for the UP in the 1990s. In 2006, Jay drove crew van for the BNSF, but kept alert and learned a lot of the nuts and bolts of railroad operations. Jay had quit the UP in 1997 after he lost two very good friends who were killed in a head-on collision

in June of that year. (See Jay's TRIBUTE to this incident in the summer issue of ALL ABOARD!. Jay carries some guilt, because he was scheduled to work with southbound UP the night of the collision. He had traded shifts 12 hours before he was to have gone on duty.

Jay has an interest in model railroading, but is not presently active in the hobby. He prefers spending time around the prototype. He has a small HO collection of locomotives that he personally painted. He feels he will re-join the hobby someday soon. Railroading is just in his blood.

Along with his railroad interest, Jay enjoys photography, writing, and traveling. He has authored several accomplished articles and poems. Jay recently finished a composition on Missouri Pacific's SD fleet that has been submitted to **DIESEL ERA** Magazine. Someday, he would like to write a book about the 1997 head-on collision of the two Union Pacific freight trains in Texas. He has many "Screaming Eagles" photo-





Graphs on-line and has contributed numerous articles on the MoPac Historical Society site. To mention a few; "Cotulla Crash", "Abilene Southern," "SD Story," (the original), "MP 3211," and "Dark Territory. On a sister site, 'PLAINS-WEST," you can find many of Jay's photos of other railroads. You can access some of Jay's photos by Googling "Jay Glenewinkel" or checking his Facebook.com page. In addition to his being a life-long railfan, Jay had some involvement in the country music industry from 1991-2003. Most of this was on a local/regional level as it was a part-time career juggled between his regular jobs as crew van driver for the Union Pacific. Jay felt he was a most active and energetic person in those days.


There is another side to Jay that he may be too humble to admit, but he really cares about helping his fellow man. He produced and promoted a fundraising event for the American Red Cross as part of an effort to help the victims of major flooding in San Antonio in October 1998. He participated in a fundraising event for the Texas Special Olympics, hosted by the Dallas



Cowboys. Jay personally donated from his own financial resources and promoted a fundraising event for the St. Jude's Hospital in Memphis TN. In 2002, he coordinated the efforts of several non-profit organizations to raise money for a family who had lost their daughter in a fire. Then in 2005, Jay volunteered again with the American Red Cross to assist victims of Hurricane Katrina – personally adopting a family and helping them purchase food, clothes, and locating a place to stay. In March 2008 he volunteered as part of the TV show, "Extreme Makeover Home Edition" to help build a home for a displaced hurricane-related family. He then helped build a new church near downtown New Orleans. Jay has had ups and downs in his life, but it is easy to see that this railfan has a heart full of kindness and good intentions.

For the future of ALL ABOARD! and our entire REA Ministry, Jay is full of suggestions and a desire to see us reach out with the Gospel. He thinks we should increase the size of the magazine; should produce a full fund-raising rail calendar; should get our information into the hands of more hobby shops and actual railroad yard facilities. I am so glad to see a new member with a forward thinking direction. Look for articles by Jay in future issues of ALL ABOARDI. Currently, he is putting the finishing touches on a story of one of our members who retired from the New York Central RR. We are always looking for printable material. "Thanks, Jay Glenewinkel!"

CASEY JONES - "The Lost Episodes"




The only authentic photo of Casey at the controls of his locomotive, No. 631.

My TV fare in the 1950's included Rin-Tin-Tin, Roy Rogers, and Sky King, but I wish I had known about the American children's Western series that ran during the '58-'59 TV season. Based around the pioneering western railroads, CASEY JONES aired 32 episodes in the USA, UK, and Australia. The series was set in the late 19th Century featuring the adventures of RR engineer Casey Jones (Alan Hale, Jr. "Gilligan's Island), and the crew of the "Cannonball Express" steam locomotive, with fireman Wallie Sims (Dub Taylor) and conductor Redrock Smith (Eddy Waller), working for the Midwest & Central RR. Casey lived in Midvale, a fictional town within commuting distance of St. Louis, MO, with his wife Alice (Mary Lawrence), their young son Casey Jr. (Bobby Clark), and their dog Cinders. Although there really was a famous locomotive engineer named Casey Jones, the TV series was very loosely based on him. It did use the real name of his train, "The Cannonball

Express," and his fireman, The 32 half-hour Wallie. black & white episodes were shot on a special set at Ray

"Crash" Corrigan's studio Corriganville in the Simi Valley, CA. The locomotive used was the Sierra No. 3. It was also used in "Little House on the Prairie" and many other TV shows. Although there are some transfer issues, you can view most of the episodes on YouTube. Google "Casey Jones Girl In The Cab part 1" to get started. (Three parts: 10 min, 10 min, 6 min.) You can then access other episodes off the screen menu. The episode "Dutch Clock" is a single 25:59 showing. Google "Casey Jones TV Series" for a complete listing and description of all 32 episodes. You will also find info on purchasing the complete 4-DVD series for around \$50. This will take your railroad viewing pleasure back to the enjoyable 1950's.



WHAT in the world?

In our Spring 2012 issue we asked our readers what in the world was this early railway contraption.

We receive two responses. Frist response was from Rev. Steve Seidler, (Owatonna, MN), who is our Associate Editor of the Model and Rail Fan pages.

That is a photo from the collection of Jim Lydon. A Mr. Holman, inventor of the Holman Truck Appliance, leased locomotive No. 6 from the Minneapolis, St. Paul & Sault Ste. Marie Railway Company...or better known as the SOO LINE. His purpose was to demonstrate his contraption in 1894 on SOO rails in Minneapolis. The appliance reduced the revolutions of the driving wheels and increased the speed of the locomotives. However, his invention was a failure. I imagine it failed for any number of reasons. Can you imagine a UP "Big Boy" operating on this contraption?

The second one was from John Lounsberry, (Hammonton, NJ), who has been a member of the Patcong Valley Model Railroad Cub, (see Summer 2012 issue) and is currently their Vice President.

The device under the locomotive wheels was called "The Holman Speeding Truck", manufactured by the Holman Company. The device was designed to permit greater speed without increase in either piston speed or fuel consumption. It was also suppose to reduce track damage by spreading the locomotives weight over the additional wheels. The Reading's Atlantic City Railroad took delivery of one such locomotives, #10, from the Baldwin Locomotive Works in 1897. On one occasion a speed of 105.8 mph was reached on a test run with a five car special train. This engine was used between Winslow Jct. and Cape May, NJ. The one drawback to the design was the elevated center of gravity, which made it easier to tip over. Locomotive #10 was used for only a few month when it derailed near Cape Court House, NJ.



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
